# Seeking God like Water on a Dry Hot Day

#### **Psalm 63:1**

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water.

> If this is where you are at right now, take courge! You are in exactly the right place.

## Psalm 42:5. 11 & 43:5

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

#### Psalm 42:1-4

- Longing for God
- As a deer pants for flowing streams,
  - so pants my soul for you, O God.
- <sup>2</sup> My soul thirsts for God,

for the living God.

When shall I come and appear before God? (lit "see the face of God")

- The Discouragement of Unbelievers
- <sup>3</sup> My tears have been my food day and night, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?"

- <sup>4</sup> These things I remember,

as I pour out my soul:

how I would go with the throng

and lead them in procession to the house of God

with glad shouts and songs of praise,

a multitude keeping festival.

Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

### Hebrews 11:39-40

<sup>39</sup> And all these, though commended through their faith, did not receive what was promised, <sup>40</sup> since God had provided something better for us, that apart from us they should not be made perfect.

## Jesus Praying this Psalm

### **Hebrews 12:1-2**

<sup>1</sup> *Therefore*, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, <sup>2</sup> looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God.

  - 2. **Unlike** it (Gospel Community)

Matthew 18:20 (Cf. 2 Cor. 3:18)

For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I among them." (Church discipline; Heb. 12:23 above)
